Sparkling Creativity in our 'Always Children' Session

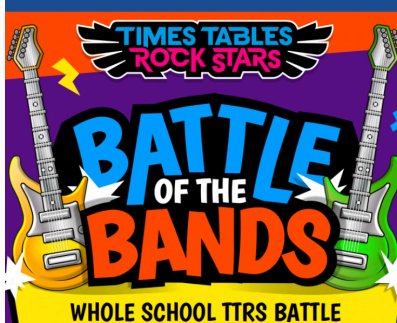
