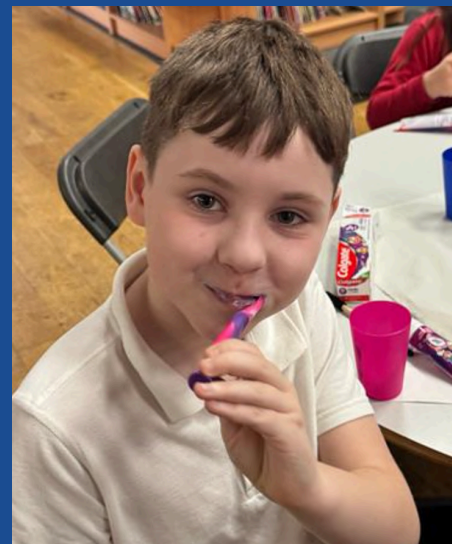
Science Spotlight: The Journey of Life
