PC Paul Visits Years 5 & 6: Crime and Consequences

We were delighted to welcome PC Paul into school this week for an incredibly important, interactive workshop with our Year 5 and Year 6 students. The session focused on helping the children understand the real-world impact of their choices, peer pressure, and how the law applies to young people.

Through group discussions and real-life scenarios, the children explored how minor actions can escalate and how a single decision can ripple out to affect families and entire communities. Here are a few key facts and talking points shared during the session that we encourage you to discuss at home:

- The legal age of criminal responsibility is 10 years old. This means children from Year 5 upwards can be held legally accountable for their actions.
- The Law Online: PC Paul heavily emphasized that the digital world is no different from the real world. Sending hurtful messages, sharing inappropriate images, or cyberbullying carry the exact same legal consequences as face-to-face offences.
- Joint Enterprise: The students learned about the reality of "standing by." If a group commits an offence, anyone who knowingly stays, encourages, or participates can face the exact same legal consequences as the person who actually did it.
- Smart Choices: The session wrapped up with practical strategies on how to handle peer pressure, say "no" safely, and look out for one another.
